Newaygo Public Schools Superintendent Search Press Release February 8, 2023

The Newaygo Public Schools Board of Education continues to move forward with the process of selecting a new Superintendent of Schools. Nineteen educators responded to the posting with preliminary applications for the position. Five candidates eventually withdrew or did not complete the application fully. Applicants consisted of current superintendents, central office administrators, principals, and intermediate school district employees. The position attracted interest from Michigan, Washington and South Carolina. The Board completed a thorough review of the applications and has invited **five** educators to be interviewed.

The interviews will be held on February 27<sup>th</sup> and 28th. The interviews are open to the public and the public is encouraged to attend. Interviews will be held at the Newaygo High School cafeteria.

The superintendent search became necessary as Superintendent Jeff Wright announced plans to retire as early as June 30, after serving the district admirably for two years. The process has been facilitated by the Michigan Leadership Institute.
