2017-2018 School Year

2nd grade moved to Vera Wilsie. (they joined Kindergarten and 1st grade there). 3rd & 4th grade remain at Velma Matson building. New Kindegarten, 1st & 4th grade wings are constructed Spring/Summer, 2018

Kindergarten, 1st, & 4th grade move into their new spaces at the new facility. Work commences on other district projects (MS & HS entrances, bus garage parking lot, etc.)

2018-2019 School Year

NPS Brings Back the School Nurse Position

Welcome to our new school nurse, Ms. Jennifer Stephens! Recently, NPS made a decision to utilize 31a (at-risk) funds to bring back the nurse position to our school district. Several years ago, NPS students were served by a school nurse but as budgets became tight, the position was cut. Unlike our neighboring districts, we do not have a school health center. Additionally, we have seen an increase in

the number of students who have medical needs. School nurses do so much more than hand out band aids. Managing student medications, asthma, diabetes, allergies, student injuries, malnutrition, immunizations, pediculosis, etc., are all examples of conditions where our students need support and assistance while they are at school. Ms. Stephens is a Registered Nurse who previously worked at DeVos Children's Hospital. Her "home base" is at the Vera Wilsie building at this time, but she is ready and available to provide assistance for all K-12 students. Music is a Slam Dunk

In its first year of implementation the new music classes are a hit. Students in grades K-5 are now receiving regular music instruction for the first time in over five years. The music program had originally been replaced with a Writing Strategies class to increase student performance in writing. Since then Newaygo Public Schools has implemented Thinking Maps and Write from the Beginning and Beyond to provide the writing instruction that was needed.

During the week of October 2, the "I can statements" or learning targets for students K-5 were I can keep a steady beat, I can differentiate between beat and rhythm, and I can read quarter notes, half notes, whole notes, eighth notes, and quarter rest. To further engrain these targets during this week, students in grades 3-5 were given basketballs to bounce and follow the beat, rhythm, notes, and rests. This active learning provided students with an opportunity to move while they learned. It was awesome to see and hear the improvement over the week!





She talked about new reporting and assessments that show a need for nutrition education within Newaygo County. The program has a committee that looks at how to implement smarter lunchrooms in the county; saturating school environment with healthy choices. Ms. Jordan also teaches students tips and eating habits, as well as taste testing healthy snack options. M-STEP Data – Dr. Mathis

Dr. Mathis gave a brief overview to the board with scores on our district as well as other districts that had the same student count and the same number of free & reduced lunches. Mathis noted there should be new data; sub-group scores, that will be brought forward in future months.

PBIS - Principals

Principal updated the board on current PBIS, explaining the importance, the need and ways to continuously improve the program.


