Dear NPS Community,

Where we have been

March 12, 2020. The day that significantly changed how we view and conduct school. On this date, our varsity girl's basketball players were preparing to continue their amazing tournament run in the MHSAA Girls Division 2 Tournament. Coming off a last second regional win over G.R. Christian, our girls were getting ready for the challenge of their lives – a contest against G.R. West Catholic. It then all screeched to a halt. The game was cancelled and at 11:00 p.m. that evening, Governor Whitmer ordered all schools to close due to COVID-19. I am sure at that time we all felt like this was going to be a 2-3 week break from school. That was not to be. On April 2, 2020, Governor Whitmer ordered all schools to close for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year.

This sudden closure left educators confused and concerned. The first order of the day was to figure out how to provide food for our students. NPS participated in the Unanticipated School Closure Program. As of the June 3, NPS has served 39,521 lunches and 39,520 breakfasts to kids in our community. In terms of teaching, some educators had dabbled in online instruction but suddenly, distance/remote learning became a reality for all of us. Our teachers then simply did what teachers do – rolled up their sleeves and got to work. Immediately, NPS had to devise a Continuity of Learning Plan to be submitted to the state. This plan outlined what we were going to do for teaching and learning for students while the school buildings were shut down. High school students had chromebooks in their possession already. Plans were made to get middle school students equipped with chromebooks if they needed a device at home. It was decided that learning for K-4 would be done with paper packets. Ultimately, a majority of our students in K-12 were provided with learning packets, as internet connectivity in many areas of Newaygo County is problematic.

When students were no longer physically attending school after the first shutdown announcement in March, we did not know long the shutdown was going to last. Consequently, the first week of June, we allowed students and parents to return to buildings to retrieve belongings, turn in homework, etc. Our school year officially ended on June 4, 2020. We plan to honor our Class of 2020 seniors with commencement on July 30, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. on the high school football field if executive orders and guidelines allow us to do so.

Where we are going

In planning for the 2020-2021 school year, we know we have to be flexible and ready for different scenarios. If in-person teaching and learning cannot happen, what does that mean? We will be working over the summer to collect information and work collaboratively to put plans in place so that our students can still receive a high quality NPS education. We'll be getting direction from multiple education leadership groups, the Michigan Dept. of Education, the Health Department, the CDC, etc. Everyone longs to get back to normal. Here at NPS, we will be careful and thoughtful when moving forward. Of course, we want to educate our kids in person but our first priority is the health and safety of students and staff. As things develop over the summer, please be sure to check the district webpage and social media accounts for updates. As always, please do not hesitate to contact me at 231.652.4933.


Newaygo High School Principal, Brad Reyburn, is pleased to announce the top ten for the graduating Class of 2020.






