We are making progress with the construction project. The last newsletter (November 17, 2017) featured some pictures of the exterior and a timeline.

As the exterior areas were completed, this allowed contractors to work on the interior areas through the winter months. Progress is being made with the installation of cabinets, classroom sinks, restrooms, flooring, HVAC, and wiring. It is very exciting to report that things are on schedule and in many cases under budget.

Work will continue on the elementary building and the following is a list of items to be worked on starting in June when school is out.

- •Secure entrance to the middle school.
- •Secure entrances to the high school.
- •Bus garage/Maintenance building area parking lot replaced.
- •Roof and chimney work at the high school.
- •Control system upgrades at the high school and middle school.
- •Renovation of 2nd & 3rd grade wings at the Elementary building.
- •Renovation of the gym and cafeteria areas of the Elementary building.

The goal is still to have Kindergarten, 1st, & 4th grade to be moved in completely by Fall, 2018. The 2nd & 3rd graders will be occupying their new renovated space by the mid-point of the 2018-2019 school year.

Demolition of the Vera Wilsie building will occur when the building is completely vacated which is planned for the winter/spring of the 2018-2019 school year.



their school.








Learning about Force and Motion in Science Class

gineering a boat that will float. They will keep the time that it takes for the boat to go across a bin. After the timed run, they will redesign their boat to have "Drag". They goal is to see how much they can slow down their boat. Many of the new Next Generation Science Standards have Engineering as a huge part of study. These practices allow students to apply their learning to real life experiences.


on WZZM 13 morning segment to share the total number of toys collected for the Toys for Tots School Spirit Challenge.

Second grade students have been working hard on science this year! Our first unit was called Material Magic - and this unit developed the idea that by taking advantage of the properties of materials, we can solve many problems in our lives. Through hands-on investigation, students explored the material properties

involved in meeting basic needs (such as clothing and cooking). We are currently working on our 2nd unit called Work of Water.



This unit helps students develop the idea that water is a powerful force that reshapes the earth's surface. Students see that water isn't just something we drink. It carries sand to create beaches, carves out canyons and valleys and, as ice, scrapes entire areas flat.

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Once again the Newaygo tree lighting celebration was a huge success! The students enjoyed making ornaments for the tree. Some students made ornaments that the birds and squirrels could enjoy throughout the winter. Others made beautiful ornaments that hung on a garland.
